
Can you identify this picture?

GREENE LOSES FORMER AUDITOR

Frederick "Freddie" Kraiss, Greene Township Auditor from 1980 through 1996 died Wednesday, August 1, 2001

Freddie was a longtime servant of the community, serving as first deputy in the Franklin County Register and Recorders Office for 32 years. He was a member of the Kittochtinny Historical Society, the Greene Township Lions Club and BPO Elks 600 of Chambersburg

We, at Greene Township, will miss Freddie for his longtime service to the residents of Greene Township as auditor. He served on the Greene Township Board of Auditors for almost 17 years, resigning in 1996 after moving to the Penn Hall community in the Borough of Chambersburg.

Freddie will be greatly missed.

BULK COLLECTION

Fall Bulk collection has been scheduled for Friday and Saturday September 21 & 22, 2001. The collection will be at the Township building located at 1145 Garver Lane in the village of Scotland. The collection will begin Friday at 7:00 AM and will finish at 3:00 PM. The collection will begin Saturday at 6:00 AM and will finish at 4:00 PM. This is a service provided free of charge to the residents of Greene Township from the supervisors. Please inform your neighbors and friends of this service and encourage them to participate.

Please do not bring batteries, liquefied paints, spray cans, tires, computers and other hazardous materials because we will be unable to accept them. We will accept items not picked up by your regular trash service.

In addition, construction debris will not be accepted. Arrangements will have to be made with the landfill to dump construction debris. Construction debris will be refused.

Yard waste will also not be accepted during bulk collection. Greene Township accepts yard waste on a regular basis at our yard waste composting facility on Mickey's Inn Road. Consequently, yard waste will be refused.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

This year the Greene Township Board of Supervisors has initiated the purchase of almost fifty-five acres of land in the heart of Scotland. As our township becomes increasingly developed and land values continue to rise, the Board of Supervisors believed it was prudent to acquire land now for use in the future.

Three properties were purchased in 2001. All three of these properties are directly adjacent to our current municipal complex. These acquisitions will make any future expansion of our essential services possible but will also allow for future recreation and open space opportunities.

Any development of this land for recreational purposes will be preceded by a professionally designed master plan, which will require community input and involvement. The Greene Township Board of Supervisors will work to keep you informed of future developments in this area.

COMPOSTING FACILITY

The Greene Township yard waste composting facility continues to be open to Greene Township residents on Saturdays from 8:00AM until 1:00PM. This schedule will continue throughout the fall.

You may also make an appointment by calling the Greene Township Board of Supervisors at (717) 263-9160.

The facility cannot except limbs and trees in excess of four inches in diameter or shrubbery with the root ball still attached.

WINTER IS JUST AROUND THE CORNER

As summer draws to a close, winter will be fast approaching. The Greene Township Board of Supervisors would like the residents of Greene Township to help us as we attempt to maintain safe and passable roads this winter. You can assist us by remembering a few important tips.

- Please do not park on township roads and cul-de-sacs. Your car can be damaged from snow and other debris being moved by the plow. This is also a violation of the vehicle code.
- When following a snow- plow please remain a safe distance behind the vehicle so that the operator can see you. These trucks stop and back up often as well as deposit anti-skid on the road surface.
- Do not shovel snow from your property onto the road surface or plow across the road to deposit the snow on the other side. These practices reduce the melting effect of the salt and remove the anti-skid from the road surface. This creates an icy patch on the road that is very difficult to remove. This is also against the law and you can be fined up to \$300 per incident.
- If your mailbox is located within the legal right-of-way and it has been damaged in the past, homeowners may want to consider relocating the mailbox. Make sure your mailbox is firmly supported in the ground. Place reflective tape on the mailbox to make it more visible. Remove snow from around the mailbox.

These are all very important tips, but most important of all, if you don't have to be traveling please stay home. The least amount of vehicles on the road the better it is for our operators to do a fast and effective job of removing snow and ice.
