The Greene Township Board of Supervisors held the first of two (2) Public Hearings on Tuesday, March 9, 2010, at the Township Municipal Building, 1145 Garver Lane, Scotland, PA. The Public Hearing was held to gain public input regarding prohibit parking on a portion of the south side of Fayetteville Main Street.

The Chairman called the Public Hearing to order at approximately 7:00 P. M..

The Township Engineer, Gregory Lambert, presented an *Engineering and Traffic Study* outlined on a PennDOT form he received at a recent seminar sponsored by PSATS (State Association) that was held regarding this very subject. Mr. Lambert reviewed his comments and stated the statistics warrant no parking in this vicinity—Fayetteville East Main Street from its intersection with Mont Alto/Coldspring Roads, south side, easterly direction distance of 200 feet to be enforced by the Ordinance prepared by the Township Solicitor. The Chairman noted the (PennDOT) form will be seen more often in the future and Mr. Lambert stated there should be one done for everything related to traffic matters. Resident Kenneth Wagaman asked if the no parking was going to be for the south side only and Mr. Lambert stated ‘yes’ because the north side (of Fayetteville East Main Street) in this vicinity is already posted. He and other Board Members noted that enforcement is a major problem. The Zoning Officer stated he had a recent conversation with State Police and was informed there is a provision in the State Vehicle Code regarding enforcement. Discussion ensued briefly regarding no parking at other locations where primarily site visibility is the main issue and whether traffic studies had been performed for all areas. Supervisor Burns stated that at an earlier meeting it was discussed that PennDOT would be petitioned for a 4-way stop at this intersection and also ask assistance from local legislators; Mr. Lambert stated he would follow up. Following discussion, on a motion by Todd E. Burns, seconded by Travis L. Brookens, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board unanimously voted that Township **Ordinance No. 2010-1** to prohibit parking along the south side of Fayetteville East Main Street from the intersection of Mont Alto/Coldspring Roads in an easterly direction 200 feet be approved.

There being no further business before the Board regarding this Public Hearing, the Chairman adjourned at approximately 7:10 P.M..
