The Greene Township Board of Supervisors held the first of five (5) Public Hearings on Tuesday, November 9, 2010, at the Township Municipal Building, 1145 Garver Lane, Scotland, PA. This Public Hearing was held to gain public input in the installation of “stop” signs in the Salem Road Village Development.

The Chairman called the Public Hearing to order at approximately 7:00 P. M.

The Chairman asked the Township Solicitor to proceed. The Solicitor explained that when there is a new development that proposes the construction of streets that are being dedicated to the Township, there needs to be a stop sign wherever there is an intersection. He stated that when a stop sign is posted, there needs to be an Ordinance in order to establish the fines to go with the stop sign.

He stated that this Ordinance provides for the erection of stop signs regulating the flow of traffic on Roosevelt Drive at the Intersection of Roosevelt Drive with Salem Road; on Roosevelt Drive at the intersection of Roosevelt Drive and Greene Street; and on the private right-of-way at the intersection of the private right-of-way with Greene Street and Roosevelt Drive.

On a motion by Todd E. Burns, seconded by Travis L. Brookens, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board unanimously voted that Township ***Ordinance No. 2010-9*** be approved for the installation of stop signs in the Salem Road Village Development at various intersections as described in the Ordinance.

There being no further business before the Board for this Public Hearing, the Chairman adjourned at approximately 7:05 P. M.
