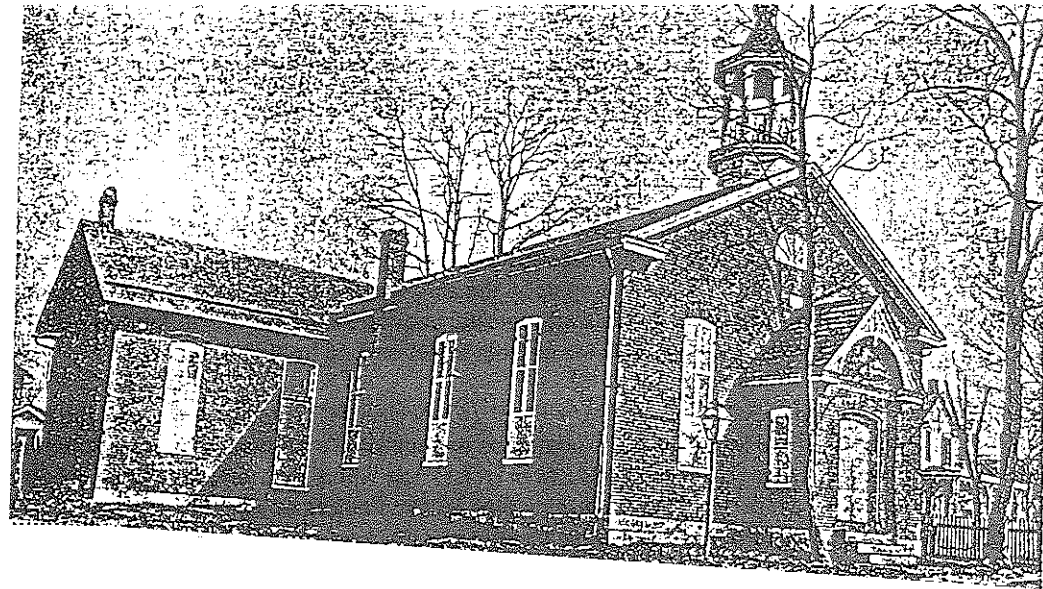


CAN YOU IDENTIFY THIS PICTURE?



The picture depicted in the Summer 1998 issue of the Greene Informer was identified by two current Township residents who had both lived in the home during different periods of time. The first resident to call was Mrs. Georgianna Huston who related that she had lived in the home with her late husband, Jim, for a number of years. The second resident, who wished to remain anonymous, related that she and her family lived in the home from approximately 1943 to 1952. The house at one time served as a stop over for persons traveling the railroad and is located on the north side of Scotland Main Street, second from Lincoln Street towards Scotland Elementary School.

## BULK DAY

On Saturday, October 24, 1998, between the hours of 6:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. residents will once again be able to bring their old refrigerators, mattresses, stoves, and other large items to the Township Building, located at 1145 Garver Lane in Scotland, for proper disposal. Proof of residency will be required so please bring your driver's license with you.

Last year over 66 tons of material was collected. Over 54% of it was recycled with only 30 tons being disposed of in the landfill. This service will be conducted for residents again in the spring. Watch for your next newsletter and further details about the program.

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## GREENE TOWNSHIP PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

The Chambersburg Transit Authority operates a public transportation service in Greene Township which the Township helps to finance.

The first Public transportation Service in Greene Township was offered in 1995 with a Sunday route that included the Chambersburg Mall. This service was provided for only one year. In the spring of 1996 the "Yellow Route" was established in Greene Township which included three stops: Red Bridge, Minnich Road, and the Norland Shopping Center. The Yellow Route in Greene Township has been considerably expanded since that time and a complete list of times and stops are listed with in this newsletter.

This service is financed in part by Greene Township and the advertising sponsors (Chambersburg Mall & Luther Ridge Retirement Community), along with funds from the collection of fares. Senior citizens may ride for free during certain hours. These fares are covered in part by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

# PERMIT REQUIREMENTS FOR FENCES AND SHEDS

Although the peak construction season is slowing down due to the time of the year, many residents still have various projects planned for late fall or early spring. The Township office frequently receives questions regarding the requirements for residential storage buildings or shed and also regarding construction of fences. These types of uses would fall under the category of Accessory Building Regulations. The definition in the Zoning Ordinance for an Accessory Use states: "A use customarily incidental and subordinate to the principle use of the main building and located on the same lot with such principal use or main building." An accessory use building in a residential district with a dwelling unit on the lot would usually be a detached storage utility building, a detached garage building or a fence. All buildings do require a building permit prior to starting construction. If a building is purchased already constructed and is placed on the property, a building permit is still required for it. The minimum building setback distance for a detached residential accessory building is five feet (5') off the rear property line and both of the side property lines. The front yard setback will vary depending upon the zoning district where the property is located. The front yard setback distance is the minimum setback as is required for the dwelling (principal use) on the property. In the case of a corner lot, the front yard setback distance requirements for the detached buildings applies on both street or road frontages.

A building permit must be obtained for all fences EXCEEDING FOUR FEET (4') IN HEIGHT. Fences located in the side or rear yards are exempt from property line setback requirements. The fence must be located on the applicant's property but no minimum distance is required from that property line. When erecting a fence or building, the property owner must know where their property line is located. If property lines or other markers are not available, the property owner needs to determine their location before applying for a building permit or starting any construction. Fences to be located within the front yard area or otherwise located along a road or street are exempt from property line setback requirements, provided that: (1) such fences are not located in the clear sight triangle; (2) such fences are located, constructed and maintained so as not to obscure or impair the visibility of an operator of a motor vehicle exiting the property; and, (3) such fences are see-through type fencing, being constructed of chainlink, post and rail, picket or other similar type fencing material. 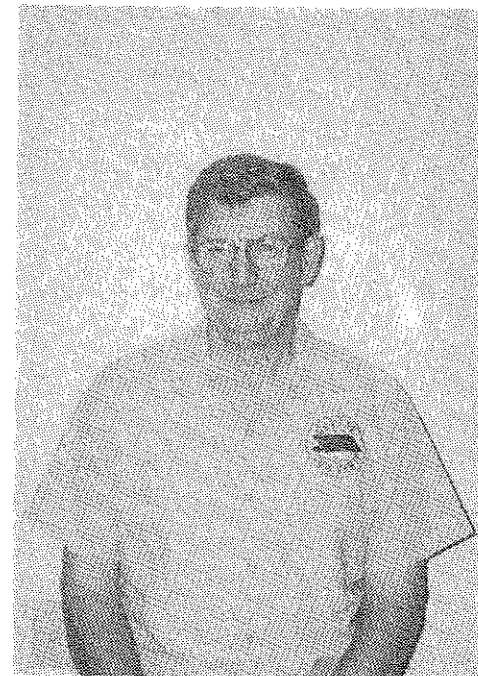
HIGHLIGHTING YOUR ELECTED OFFICIALS AND STAFF.
