



## FALL LEAF & BRUSH COLLECTION

Greene Township will be commencing Fall leaf & brush pick-up **November 16, 2009 through December 11, 2009**. The collection crew will make ONE pass through the Township. Please rake your leaves and place brush at the edge of your yard, **no further than four feet from the edge of the pavement of the road**. Do not bag your leaves. The leaves and brush must be on **separate piles** in order for the township machinery to collect it and must be placed for pick up on the **first day** of the collection schedule. If the brush and leaves are not separated, they will not be collected.



## Solid Waste Management

The Greene Township Board of Supervisors would like to remind residents and property owners Chapter 73 of the Greene Township Code requires all owners of property in Greene Township shall provide for the regular preparation, collection and removal of all municipal waste generated at such properties.

Recyclables shall be kept separate from and disposed of separately from municipal waste. Residential properties shall recycle clear and colored glass and aluminum, steel and bimetallic cans. Nonresidential properties shall recycle clear, colored glass, aluminum, steel and bimetallic cans and corrugated paper and high-grade office paper.

It shall be unlawful for a person to collect, remove or dispose of municipal waste which contains recyclables mixed with the municipal waste.

Violation of provisions of Chapter 73 of the Township Code is punishable by up to a \$1000 fine.

## United States CENSUS 2010

Greene Township is partnering with the U.S. Census Bureau to conduct the 2010 Census counts.

### What is the Census?

- The census is a count of everyone living in the United States every 10 years.
- The census is mandated by the U.S. Constitution.
- The next census is in 2010.
- Your participation in the census is required by law.
- It takes less than 10 minutes to complete.
- Federal law protects the personal information you share during the census.
- Census data are used to distribute Congressional seats to states, to make decisions about what community services to provide, and to distribute \$300 billion in federal funds to local, state and tribal governments each year.

The Greene Township Board of Supervisors would like to encourage you to complete & return your Census Questionnaire when you receive it in early 2010. Spending just a few minutes to fill out your census form will help ensure our community gets its fair share of federal and state funding.

## Greene Township Park Update

Earthmoving and excavation activities continue to make progress and will continue through the summer months on Phase I of the Greene Township Park located off Elevator Street and Black Gap Road in Scotland. Walking trails are now constructed in stone and open for use by the public. The park will be open to the public during daylight hours only. Pets are permitted in the park but must be leashed and under the immediate control of a responsible adult at all times and shall not be allowed to disturb or annoy park visitors. Owners must clean up dog litter and dispose of properly.

Proposed improvements for Phase I include two soccer/multi purpose fields, an adult baseball field, a youth baseball/softball field, tot lot, walking trails, picnic areas, pavilions, restrooms/concession building and parking areas. ## Composting Facility

The Greene Township yard waste composting facility will continue to be open Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. This schedule will continue throughout the year except on holidays, holiday weekends or special events such as bulk collection days. If the compost facility will be closed, signs will be posted at the gates.

The composting facility accepts most types of yard waste except grass clippings. **All material generated by the composting facility is available only to current township residents, photo identification will be required, at a cost of \$5.00 per small bucket scoop and \$10.00 per large bucket scoop, No dump truck loads permitted.** At various times during the year, after completing the composting process, leaf compost and bark mulch are available for pick-up. Material is on a first come first served basis. You may stop by the facility on Mickey's Inn Road during regular hours to check on availability.

**The Greene Township yard waste composting facility is a service provided by the Greene Township Board of Supervisors and is partially funded through recycling grants provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection.**

## PARKING PROHIBITED ON TOWNSHIP ROADS

The Greene Township Board of Supervisors would like to remind residents, property owners and visitors to our roadways, Section 94-8 of the Greene Township Code states, **"it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle upon the cartway or within two feet next adjacent to the cartway of Township roads. For the purposes of this section, the road cartway is that portion of the paved roadway delineated by the white lines marking each side of the road."** It is an important safety issue that streets remain open for emergency vehicle passage. Violation of this section of the Township Code is punishable by fines.
